MEL IS GOOD FOR YOUR HEALTH! - By Gerry Linda

Many of you probably remember that Ralph Rehbock's was featured and quoted in the **New York Times** on Saturday, 8/9/2025: "For 'Super-Agers,' Sharp-Witted and Over 80, Sociability Is a Trait They Share." Ralph was kind enough to mention both MEL and the Meltones in the article. He and four other Melmen (see photos below) are in the study.

The article summarized 25 years of research among adults over 80, who have the memory ability of someone 20-30 years younger. The findings indicate that race, gender, diet--including alcohol consumption, smoking, exercise regimens, types and numbers of medications are variables that do not matter. The one thing that seems to make a difference is the degree of social interactions—the more, the better. People who socialize more are more resistant to cognitive decline as they age and they have generally larger brains than their peers as well.

Currently, it is not clear whether more socializing leads to better cognition or that better cognition leads to more socializing.
